Developing inclusive and safe fieldwork settings

Watch for registration information for our webinar, "Developing Inclusive and Safe Fieldwork Settings," on Tuesday, January 13 at 11:00 am central time.

Fieldwork is an important and transformative part of science. However, it also carries higher risk of harassment and sexual assault. Join us for this webinar where we will discuss fieldwork safety and provide best practices and resources for field leaders and participants to ensure inclusive and safe environments with a particular focus on ensuring all are safe (especially those with marginalized genders, sexual orientations, and ethnicities). Topics include:



- Developing field-ready protocols for your unique field setting
- Recognizing and mitigating risk factors in field settings
- Identifying reporting requirements and channels while in the field
- Providing templated field safety guides, community agreements, and a field safety checklist
- Discussing safe intervention during incidents using a suite of bystander tools
