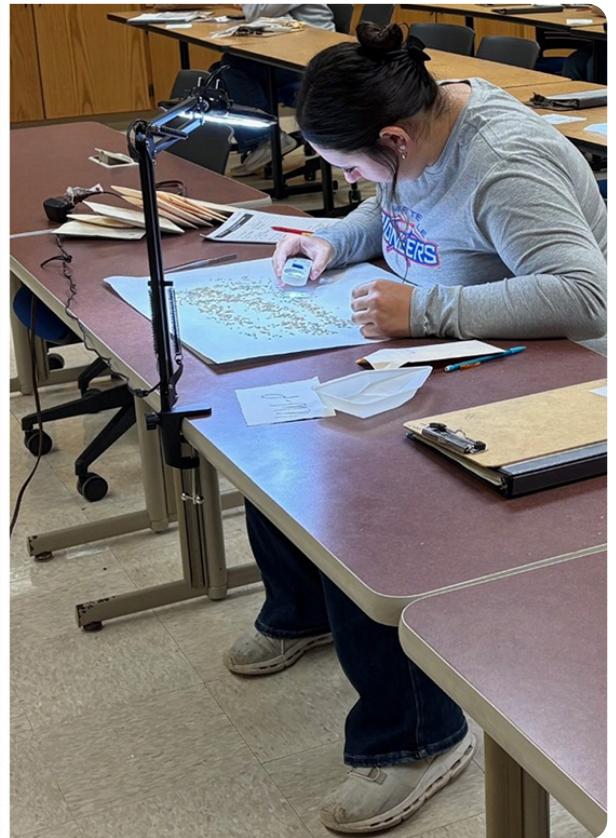

Salm. Right panel: Sydney Rider.

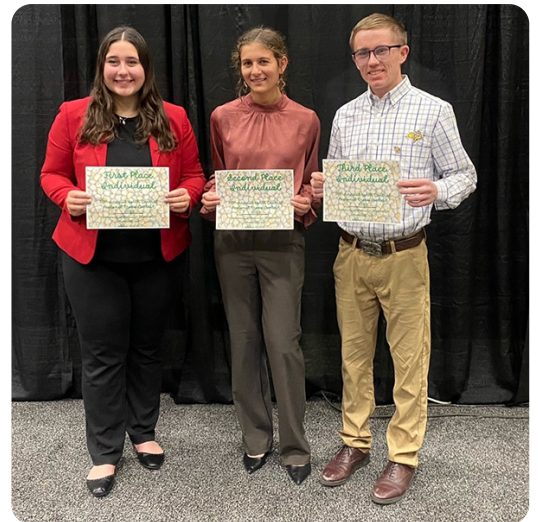
The Collegiate Crops Team from the University of Wisconsin–Platteville (UW–Platteville) secured first place overall at the Regional Collegiate Crops Judging Contest held on the UW–Platteville campus on October 18.

The team, consisting of Marissa Folkers, Sydney Rider, and Delaney Salm, achieved first place in the overall team competition while Sydney Rider placed first in the individual competition. South Dakota State University placed second in both team and individual competition.
